Calendar of Saints - August 25 - Saint Joseph Calasanz

Saint Joseph Calasanz was born in a castle in Aragon, Spain, in 1556 and is often referred to by his Latin name, Calasancius. At age 28 he was ordained, so concerning himself with religious reform that he was appointed vicar-general at 34. In 1592, he gave up his position and left for Rome, where he lived for five years as a pilgrim. Joseph became aware of the plight of poor children and their need for education. When he could not get permission for them to attend regular schools, he saw God calling him to something himself. Using his inheritance, he set up free schools for the poor. From the community of teachers, Joseph founded the Order of Clerks Regular of Religious Schools, which spread throughout Italy and beyond. Unfortunately, there was dissension in the order; a papal commission eventually dissolved the order in 1646. Joseph died in 1648, but his hopes were fulfilled in 1669 when the order was re-formed; it continues today, known as the Piarists or Scolopi. Joseph was canonized in 1767 and is a patron of schools serving the needs of poor children.
